





SMECEYI as a Regional Opportunity



- Launched in March, the Swiss-Middle East Circular Economy for Youth Initiative (SMECEYI) is about developing innovative solutions to two issues at once: Extensive waste generation and Youth unemployment
- 9 teams of students of universities from the UAE, Lebanon, Occupied Territory of Palestine and Saudi Arabia (originally 15)
- Supported by Swiss mentors (professors, students) through the Leading House MENA
- The 5 finalists will showcase their solutions at the Swiss Pavilion in November 2021




